The **Tribal Gaming Protection Network (TGPN)** is an initiative of Ernie Stevens Jr., Chairman of the **National Indian Gaming Association (NIGA)**. TGPN, a national organization, was in response to the increased need to train, educate and provide networking

opportunities for those working within tribal communities, casinos and gaming commissions. Andrew Hofstetter was appointed by Chairman Stevens, as TGPN Chairman in 2015. Andrew leads the 18 - TGPN board of directors and advisory board to impact and improve; training, education and networking opportunities nationwide. The newly created **National**

Indian Casino Safety Association (NICSA) was formed to provide information sharing, training, and mentoring relating to the health and safety aspects within gaming and tribal government communities. NICSA was formed in 2016 and reports to the TGPN. Together, they have formed a united front in protecting Indian Gaming today and for future generations.
